(89% of the total) and the unemployment rate fell by 1 point. YOY total job growth peaked in

September 1994 at 76,400. Nevada's U-6 rate (unemployed, marginally attached and forced part-time workers) in Q2, 2017 dropped to 11.5%, but it is still the third highest in the U.S. Average weekly inflation-adjusted wages increased 0.1% compared to June 2016. The state's

economy in 2017 is growing steadily and we expect it to continue through the end of the year.
